

OXFORD HUNT COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION POOL USE

There are two documents that pertain to the use of the pool.

1. The **'Pool Admittance Rules'** - explains who can use the pool, when they can use the pool and how they can use the pool.
 2. The **'Pool Rules and Regulations'** - explains how people shall conduct themselves at the pool, what is and is not allowed while using the pool.

Pool Admittance Rules

1. The pool is for the exclusive use of Oxxford Hunt Community Association (OHCA) Pool Members and their Guests.
2. OHCA members must follow both the Pool Admittance Rules and the Pool Rules.
3. Pool Members and their guests will be required to check-in at the check-in desk.
POOL MEMBERS are Oxxford Hunt Community Association homeowners and their resident families (children, stepchildren, grandparents, adopted children, etc.), and tenants.

New homeowners may obtain access to the pool by contacting the OHCA Property Manager (Omega Association Management, Inc.)

To determine membership/access to the pool, the pool attendants and lifeguards will use the OHCA provided register. Person(s) presenting for access/entry, must have a government issued photo ID and/or OHCA information on file in order to use the facility. In cases where membership requires verification, the OHCA Property Manager is the final arbiter.

GUESTS

OHCA members are required to register all guests with the attendant on duty.

- Each OHCA dwelling is allowed 4 guests per day. The fifth (5th) guest and subsequent guests will incur a \$3.00 per day admission charge. Exact change is required. No checks please!
 - Guests must follow both the Pool Admittance Rules and Pool Rules.
 - Children age 3 and under do not incur a fee.
4. VIOLATIONS: Any OHCA member or guest, who violates a Pool Admittance Rule or Pool Rule, may be immediately dismissed from the pool.
 - A first offense could result in a 1-5 day dismissal from the pool.
 - Additional offenses, serious horseplay or damage to OHCA property will result in immediate dismissal, possibly for the entire season.
 5. Pool Operating Hours: Early May through mid-September (see posted schedule at pool)
Monday- Saturday 10:00 AM to 9:00 PM
Sunday 12:00 PM to 9:00 PM

When traditional school is in session:
 - Monday – Friday 4:00PM to 8:00PM
 - Saturday 10:00AM to 8:00PM
 - Sunday 12:00PM to 8:00PM
 6. No one under the age of 18 is allowed in the Pool Area without lifeguards present. Trespassers will be dealt with accordingly.
 7. OHCA Members over the age of 18 are permitted to use the pool without lifeguards present only during the time designated for "Adult Lap Swim" (30 minutes past dawn to 9:00AM). Interested adults should complete a lap swim form to have key access for adult swim.

8. Children under 10 years of age must be accompanied by a relative 18 years of age or older. It is considered a privilege for children between 10 and 18 to come to the pool without an adult present. This privilege can be revoked for inappropriate behavior, at the management's discretion.
9. Children between the ages of 10 - 16 may be required to pass a proficiency test, at the discretion of the lifeguards, in order to enter the pool area. The proficiency test shall be the standard test provided by the Red Cross.
10. Each family may bring up to 5 guests to the pool. The homeowner on record must register each guest (each time) with the pool management and assume the responsibility for the conduct of each guest. Residents must be 16 years of age to sign in guests.
11. Unaccompanied OHCA member minor children (16+) are allowed one guest per visit and must ensure that the guest is aware of, and follows, the pool rules.
12. Guests must sign in with the pool management at the gate. Payment, when required, will be collected at sign-in.
13. Babysitters are recognized as an exception to the guest fee rules, so long as this privilege is not abused. Babysitters must be 16 years of age or older to accompany one child under the age of 10 and must have the express written permission of the parent/guardian of the minor child to attend the pool. An information sheet containing the child's parent contact information, medical insurance information and authorization to transport the child by ambulance to the nearest medical facility in case of an emergency must be provided to the Pool Attendant. Child care givers will not be allowed to bring guests to the pool. If one or more of the parents are present at the pool, the sitter is then considered a guest. The sitter is to register accordingly.
14. Residents who are delinquent in their homeowner's dues will be denied access to the pool. The Pool Attendant will be furnished with a monthly list.
15. No one with an infectious disease, diarrhea, inflamed eyes, nasal or ear discharge, open wound or bandages will be allowed in the pool. *(WCR)
16. Anyone suspected of substance abuse (including alcohol) will not be allowed in the pool area.
17. Pets and other animals are not allowed to enter the water or the pool area. *(WCR)
18. The pool is not available to rent for private functions.

*(WCR) – Wake County Regulation
